Minutes of the Meeting of Great Wilbraham Parish Council Held Tuesday 23rd April 2019 8.00pm at the Wilbrahams' Memorial Hall

18-19/147 To receive and approve apologies for absence - Apologies had been received from S Bartlett and B

Fulford which were accepted.

Proposed detached 1 ½ storey dwelling and outbuilding (alternative scheme to SCDC extant permission

The applicant talked members through the plans. Members discussed the application, which was a change of design, slight enlargement although the height is the same as the previous plans approved. S Ramus reported that she had been in contact with near neighbours who were happy with the design but raised significant concerns over traffic issues during construction. Members agreed there would need to be a robust traffic management plan in place.

Meeting closed 8.34pm

Members agreed to SUPPORT the planning application with the following comments: -

- Address of the site is to the rear of 29,31 and 33 Frog End not just 29.
- Near neighbours are largely happy with the proposed building and design, however all are concerned with the build process.
- PC members and neighbours insist that a robust, enforceable Traffic Management
 Plan is put in place before work begins. The access is in a sensitive position on a
 very narrow track / public footpath and it is imperative that work vehicles, HGV's
 etc. do not block this and cause problems for other residents and users of the
 footpath. Deliveries should be carefully overseen to prevent damage and
 disturbance to other properties

18-19/151 To consider and approve the additional £5,000 grant for the Memorial Hall Playground fund – $\mbox{\it R}$

Tippen presented information from the Memorial Hall trustees. They confirmed that project will continue with a slightly changed layout, the intention is now to commission the work in two phases. S Ramus advised that the project had been granted £15,000 from the Wadlow Wind Farm. Members felt it would be useful to see a summary of funding for the project. It was proposed by R Tippen, seconded S Ramus and unanimously RESOLVED to approve an additional grant of £5,000 from \$106 funds towards the Memorial Hall Playground project.
